ACTIVITY 4 - SINGING SAINT STEPHEN'S TROPARION

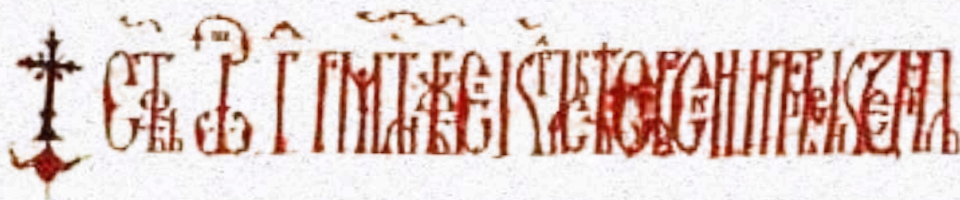
Title:	Honoring His Life Through Song
