

Srdjan Maksimovic is the Coordinator for the Diocesan Education Commission, Senior Teaching Fellow at Fordham University in New York City, and entrepreneur. He is on the cusp of completing his Ph.D., with his research centered on the Gospel of Matthew within the context of Judaism and Christianity in Antiquity. His dedication to youth education is manifest in his leadership roles within the Orthodox Christian Fellowship, his authorship of a guidebook for the Pan-Orthodox Ministries on Homelessness, collaborations with the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, serving the US as a representative to the Orthodox Youth Sector of the Assembly of Canonical Orthodox Bishops and the Orthodox Youth Directors of North America, and pioneering new courses that merge spiritual insights with environmental responsibility. Outside of the classroom, Srdjan continues his passion for the environment by founding a renewable energy company called "MP Green". Motivated by a philosophy that values transformation through education and personal development, Srdjan's comprehensive approach to socio-theological involvement and pedagogy highlights his commitment to fostering a more informed and conscientious society.
